General

Abstracts can only be submitted via email to Phyllis.Patterson@steward.org.

Please title your email “**NEARC Abstract Submission 2016**”. Submission via any other modality will not be accepted. Please also designate the category as well, see below.

The two basic categories will be:

- **Research abstracts:** reports of original research approved by their respective IRBs.
- **Case studies:** descriptions of interesting events and practices that occur in anesthesia, with educational value. All abstracts must state the problem, describe how the problem was addressed, state the results, and provide some conclusion regarding the key issues presented.

Technical Requirements

Abstract must be submitted in one of the following categories:

1. Intensive Care
2. Circulation
3. Respiration and Airway
4. Safety and Quality
5. Ambulatory
6. Perioperative Medicine
7. Neuroscience
8. Obstetric
9. Pediatric
10. Obesity and Sleep Medicine
11. Regional

Please designate a category at the time of your abstract submission

Acceptable length of the abstract is not more than:

60 lines

3000 characters

Including details and headers.

Abstract structure:

1. Title
2. Background and objectives
3. Materials and methods
4. Results
5. Conclusions
6. References

Please do not submit a draft version of the abstract. Make sure you are submitting a final version.

Abstract Review Process

A multi-institution review panel will judge the abstracts based on:

1. Scientific or clinical value
2. Relevance
3. Suitability of methods to aims
4. Conclusions based on objective results
5. Description of methods used
6. Originality of work
7. Overall impression

Abstract presentation

Once your abstract has been accepted, please format appropriately. Please use the standard 36" x 48" in a horizontal orientation. Please make sure the type is legible from a distance of 5 feet.

If an abstract is accepted as a poster presentation, the presenting author will be requested to be available for discussion during the corresponding poster viewing session.

A subset of abstracts will be chosen for oral presentation. Please prepare both a poster and an oral presentation with slides. Please limit your presentation to ten slides or less and ten minutes for length. All posters will be set up in or near the Seton Auditorium.
