GOALS / OBJECTIVES

NESA 61 addresses the following gaps: gaps that effect physician performance that may impede patient care. Actionable working knowledge of Peri-operative surgical home in design and implementation of peri-operative pathways. Algorithmic approach to shared care. For pre-, intra-and post-op team management. Same for approach to high risk, cognitively impaired patients. For all anesthesiologists participating in obstetric care: 1)Knowledge of opioid abuse and maternal and fetal implications by learning and using an Opioid Use Disorder Bundle and relevant and appropriate anesthesia management; 2) To become knowledgeable and understanding of new VTE thromboprophylaxis guidelines to be used in the decision-making process regarding neuraxial anesthesia. Reveiw the epidemiology of persistent post-op pain and its effects on patients. The current thinking of mechanisms of causation and how design appropriate pre-, intra-and post-op strategies for practicing anesthesiologists and pain management caregivers. For intensivists and critical care-anesthesiologists; learn, review and ciritcally appraise the updated Sepsis-3 definition and guidelines and recommendations for improving outcomes and decreasing mortality in spesis. The OR anesthesiologist with the knowledge to care for patients now and to integrate new findings into care pathways. For all healthcare workers: The great need for improving and sustaining improvement in global healthcare will be described. Instill energy in those wishing to participate and inform how to start and suggest pathways and organizations to sustain and grow the global health community from one who has walked the walk.

The Interactive Interscalene Brachial Plexus & Fascial Plane Workshop is intended for anesthesiologists of all skill levels who wish to improve their skills at performing ultrasound-guided interscalene brachial plexus block, as well as fascial plane blocks (transversus abdominis plane (TAP), rectus sheath, quadratus lumborum (QL), pectoralis (PECS I & II, serratus plane block), and fascia iliaca plane block), as well as ultrasound-guided infiltration techniques for knee surgery. The workshop focuses on the effective and safe use of a variety of local anesthetics (including liposomal bupivacaine) in these regional anesthetic techniques, including proper method of administration, admixing with bupivacaine HCl, appropriate volumes and concentrations of these local anesthetics, and tips and tricks on the perioperative management of patients who undergo these blocks. This interactive workshop will feature small participantto-instructor ratios and customized curriculum focusing on developing hands-on skills. Each technique will be taught by experienced instructors using dynamic multimedia presentations, live demonstrations, state of the art 3D virtual cadaver imaging and guided hands-on live model scanning.
